
Summer Activities

Off To Paris

The French Consulate supports a training workshop for the French Teacher "Ms. Juliana Tourjman".

Juliana spent time in France during the month of June 2009 to learn about the French culture and specifically to spend time working on issues of Dyslexic and hyperactive children and how to engage them in the classroom. The Workshop concentrated on the exchange of experiences, and the participants were taken to a number of nurseries where they were exposed to different systematic approaches of dealing with nursery children.

Dina was impressed by the system in Italy, whereby the municipality takes care of the registration, the nurseries, and their budgets, along other things.

Dina also liked the involvement of retired people in activities at the nurseries, such as story telling, playing with the children, baking and whatever they could do with them.

The Global Ministries General Assembly in Indianapolis

Maha Meo, staff member responsible for the sponsorship program, was invited to attend the general assembly of the global ministries in Indianapolis from July 26-August 2, 2009 where almost 6000 people were present. Maha gave presentations about the school and the role of the global Ministries substantial support which we hope would be helpful to encourage sponsors to continue being involved in the sponsorship program.
